The venue has also been recognised by the Living Wage Foundation (LWF) for ensuring that all members of staff contribute at least 12% of their salary towards their pension, with 7.5% of that coming from the employer – 4.5% more than the required minimum. The organization was also recognized as the first hospitality business to sign up as a Living Pensions Employer.
